

IT CC - 01 Statewide HRIS

- What does the request seek?
 - Statewide HRIS system for employee and position management
 - Total of \$64,631,622 over 5 years (\$956K in FY 2026-27) CCF-IT
- Why is it necessary?
 - Replaces a patchwork of agency HR systems and manual processes
 - Reduce errors and improve employee data
 - Supports DPA's Employer of Choice Wildly Important Goal (WIG) as well as the State's Partnership Agreement with WINS.
- What happens if it's not approved?
 - Disparate applications and manual processes across departments will continue to be used for critical human resource functions

IT CC - 02 Statewide Procurement System

- What does the request seek?
 - Funds for Phase II of a statewide procurement solution
 - \$2,299,500 FY 2026-27 from the Supplier Database Cash
 Fund
- Why is it necessary?
 - Phase I is actively in progress and on schedule
 - Phase II includes:
 - Solicit and contract with system vendors
 - Implement a central system that consistently tracks
 data and leverages modern e-procurement technologies
- What happens if it's not approved?
 - The State will continue to have inefficiencies and lack meaningful analytics
 - DPA will struggle to support statewide programs specifically equity in procurement/supplier diversity as well as sustainability





IT CC - 02 Statewide Procurement System

Accomplishments

- Product/Project team and governance established Summer 2025
- Gartner Group, Inc contracted September 2025
- Formal Project kickoff held October 2025
- Completed 30+ stakeholder interviews across agencies
- Created a Current State Assessment and hosted a debrief with 40 stakeholders
- Drafted Functional Requirements Matrix based on stakeholder and NASPO input
- Drafted Market Analysis Report
- Drafted Performance Statement of Work and the Legacy System Transition and Data Migration Plan
- Published project website and newsletter on 12/11/25 and launched office hours
- We will meet with Colorado Digital Services to leverage their expertise



IT CC - 02 Statewide Procurement System Stakeholder Identified Challenges

- **System Fragmentation**
 - Agencies operate within a highly fragmented technology landscape.
- **Manual Processes**

The lack of integration forces agencies to rely on manual workarounds.

- Reporting Challenges

Staff struggle to aggregate data for legislative and financial reporting.

- - Limited and Unequitable **Vendor Self-Service**

Limited VSS functionality forces vendors to contact staff, creating an unnecessary burden.

Difficulty Locating Information

Agencies and vendors lack centralized repositories for procurement templates, samples, documentation, and resources.


Compliance Barriers

Accessibility mandates and other statutory requirements must be met by all procurement tools, limiting the use of functional tools and complicating workflows.

System Roadmap



Unified, Integrated Platform

Implement a unified statewide system that streamlines the full procurement lifecycle and integrates with agency tools.



Automated Workflows and Collaboration

Automate routing, approvals, reminders, and collaboration to move away from email and spreadsheets.



Robust Reporting and Compliance

Offer audit-ready, compliant reporting across all transaction types.



Self-Service for Staff and Vendors

Enable easy search of contracts and solicitations, and provide a vendor self-service portal with tools for updating information, onboarding, and training.



Tracking, Notifications and Oversight

Incorporate tools for vendor research, drafting, and evaluation, with subcontractor tracking and support for unique agency needs.
