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Competency Dockets and Competency Diversion Program

Competency dockets provide the infrastructure for managing individuals across the full competency continuum

14 judicial districts operate adult Competency Court Dockets, serving more than 1,100 justice-involved participants

HB24-1355, Competency Diversion Program, reduces reliance on inpatient competency restoration services by diverting eligible defendants into community-based, wraparound care

Launched in five districts in April 2025 and another eight districts in October; remaining come on board July 1

Partnerships formalized with Bridges, DAs, PDs, BHA, sheriffs, mental health providers. Services provided by Bridges of Colorado's Wraparound Care Program

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Supreme Court tackling AI challenges in courts

- *Recent Amendments to the Colorado Rules of Professional Conduct
- *Created the Legal Technology Advisory Committee (LTAC) charged with drafting recommendations on use of AI in courts. Recommendations expected by October 1
- *LTAC members bring expertise from bench, bar, academia, and business
- *LTAC objectives: integrity of legal system, client services, access to justice, innovation

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AI Continued

- *SB24-205 unintentionally captured long-existed probation assessments and will require unnecessary formal notices and appeals.
- *In addition, SB24-205 requires our IT staff assess more than 80 software programs each year for potential impacts

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Family Law Rules

- Committee work continues following public comment/hearing on initial draft
- Goal:
 - Create standalone procedural rules to govern family law cases
- Purpose:
 - Address unique aspects of family law cases
 - Reduce unnecessary friction
 - Make the process easier for pro se parties

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Office of Attorney Regulation Counsel

- Protecting the public through regulation of the practice of law (licensing, discipline, disability)
- Expanding access to justice through Licensed Legal Paraprofessional (LLP) program
- Working to implement new bar exam better aligned to law school education and the modern practice of law

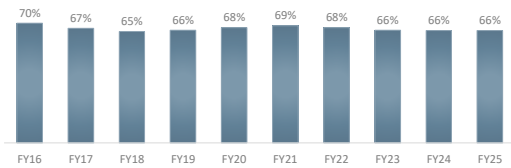

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Probation Success Rates

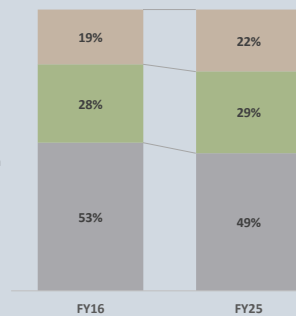


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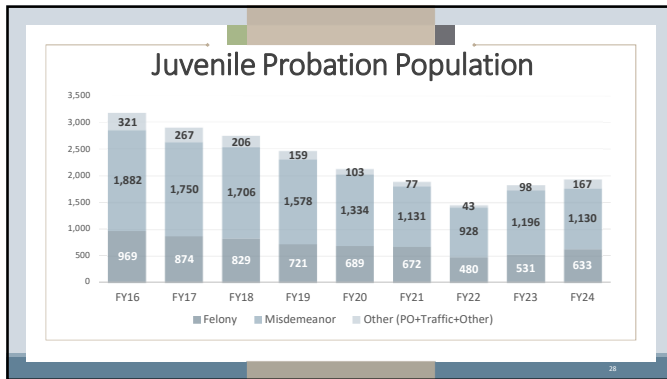
Adult probation risk level : 10-year comparison

■ Low

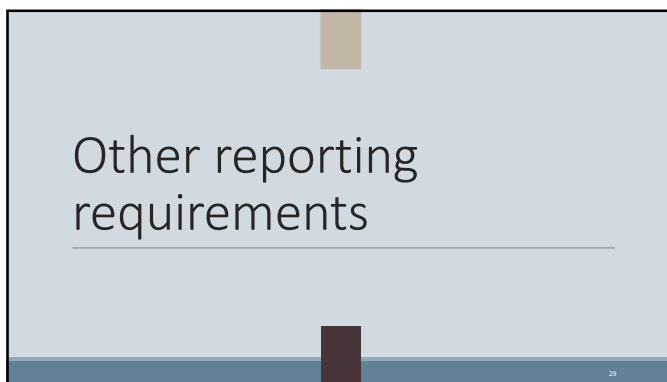


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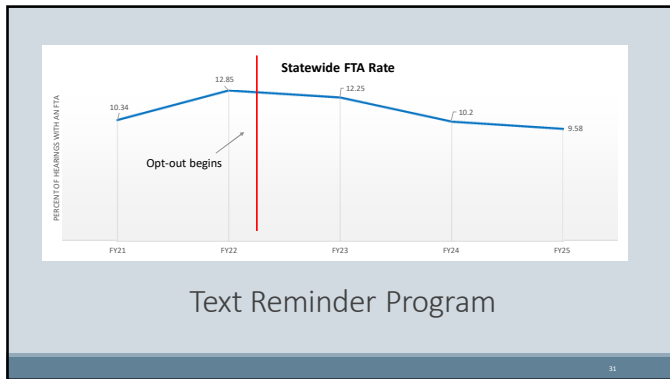
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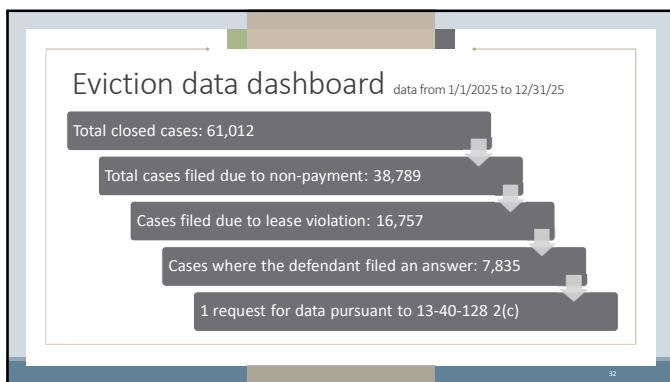
